## Yacht search continues

A search is still on for the missing Italian yacht *Vento Fresco* and her  
 two crew members.

The 35-foot sail boat was last seen on May 11, 1,000 miles northeast of the  
 Island. It was on its way to Gibraltar from St. Thomas via the Azores.

A C-130 aircraft arrived in Bermuda on Friday night to commence a  
 search the next day.

Nothing has been found, a Harbour Radio spokesman said yesterday and  
 vessels were still being asked to keep a look out for the sloop. There are no  
 immediate plans to expand the search.
